Council Meeting Minutes
September 6, 2016

Moderator Dianne Dellarco opened the meeting at 6:40 pm .Kathy Piscitello led the devotions.

Correspondence:

A 'thank you' note was read from Becky and Matt Arthur (niece and nephew of Catherine Hiller).

Once again we received an email from Lifeline requesting use of our church for the spring of 2017. Dianne will email the particulars needed to Building and Grounds people who will investigate the possibility of hosting them.

Pastor's Report:

In the Pastor's absence Dianne read the following

- Tonight I am joining Carolyn Land in making a visit to Enfield Correctional Facility to visit her son, George. Please continue to keep them all in your prayers.
- An update on Habitat for Humanity – we have been invited to partner with Union Baptist Church and Noank Baptist Church in a project involving gutting and rebuilding a property at 235 Yetter Road in Mystic. Most of the work will not begin until next spring but in preparation, if any of us would like to volunteer to participate in the work, we must attend one mandatory training session (major construction is contracted out to professionals; we would be asked to work on painting, cleaning, repairing, landscaping, or providing refreshments on work-days, etc.) Habitat is offering two sessions, Wednesday, September 14th at Union Baptist, 5-7 pm and Wednesday, September 28th here at PBBC 4-6 pm. With thanks to our Craft Ladies we have already provided a quilt for the family once they are selected, and we will have a chance in the future to provide a Prayer Shawl as well. I attended the tour of the property last week. There are many excited members of our sister churches ready to work together, building new friendships among our families of faith. Buildings/Grounds:

- Darrell met with Groton Utilities concerning the improper installation of the water meter. Dick received an estimate from J&J Plumbing for \$280.
 1. Holly Boyle motioned that we approve this expenditure with Jackie seconding. It was approved.
 2. Dick will contact J&J Plumbing to do the work.
- It was previously noted the chain on the front door of the church is difficult to hook – longer chain needed – taken care of by Darrell
- Candle holders and cross are being cleaned (Darrell)
- The wooden stand that holds the bible on the chancel is in need of painting. Darrell will take care of.
- The frames (wooden) for the flower beds out front by the sign are in desperate need of being replaced – this will be a project for the spring. While speaking about this Holly mentioned that the sign is also in need of replacement – but due to finances (and a definite plan) this too, will wait until the spring.
- Darrell noted he anticipates having surgery this fall which will restrict his ability to carry out the physical aspect of his role while he recovers. Fortunately we have a second deacon of buildings and grounds!

- In Carolyn's absence Jackie said that they will set-up for the pot luck this Saturday. Peg asked if there would be a cake to commemorate the Life Deacons and Jackie said she would see to it. Jackie also noted they would take responsibility for refreshments for the Habitat volunteer session on the 28th.

- Peg just reminded us that this Sunday was Rally Day, Homecoming and Life Deacons

- In the process of scheduling a meeting to work on Claudine's contract for next year

Old Business:

- **Water/electricity usage/bill –**
- Richard Tourjee has arranged for J&J Plumbing to install the meter correctly. We believe the water bill overages were due to several running toilets and the meter issue.
- **Washington Park Farmers Market**
- Patti said the crowd was not there because of the weather – only made \$19 - - but because of the weather they will be allowed to attend at another date at no charge – she also stated that the 'boutique' upstairs was doing quite well.
- **Church Keys**
- There is an inventory in the office.

New Business:

Church Cushions

- Patti mentioned that they need to be replaced. She had a few preliminary figures as to the cost. Some conversation ensued and when more accurate amounts are available action will be taken.
- **Gift Received**
- A substantial donation of \$1,000 was received from Rev. and Mrs. Molton earlier this summer. Upon receipt Catherine Hiller sent a thank you note; more recently, Dianne purchased a card that was sent out on behalf of the Church Council/ congregation.
