Alex Lew said he received a letter from Densmore oil looking for our business. They would give us a price cap of \$2.87 per gallon – more will follow under new business. Catherine did inform us that a letter had gone out to the tenants regarding care of outside property.

Benevolence:

Pastor's Report: :

Deacon and Committee Reports: Buildings/Grounds:

Kudos to Brian and Alex for getting the roof project done which included the insurance portion of the job right through dealing with the contractor!

- While they had the contractor here they took advantage and got an estimate for replacing the flat roof. As many of us know this room has been leaking and has caused a lot of damage over the years a flat roof in New England is never good!!! To replace the entire flat roof the cost would be \$30,000. 

Mission and Stewardship Day


Saturday, September 29, 2018 Central Baptist Church, Norwich
